Notice to Non-Partisan Voters

A registered voter who is not affiliated with a political party and who desires to vote in the Primary Election for Representative in Congress or United States Senator may request a partisan ballot from any one political party. If you choose to do so, upon announcing your name, address and political affiliation to the Election Staff, ask to vote a Non-Partisan Republican, Democratic or Libertarian Ballot. The Democratic and Libertarian Party will conduct an open Primary. If choosing Democratic or Libertarian, you will receive the Democratic or Libertarian Ballot. No such registered voter shall receive more than one such partisan ballot.

Special Levy Issue

Swimming Pool Bond

"Shall the City of Bassett, Nebraska, issue bonds of said City in the principal amount not to exceed Two Million Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a swimming pool and related improvements on land owned by the City; said bonds to bear interest at rate or rates to be determined by the Mayor or City Council of the City and to become due at such time or times as may be fixed by the Mayor and City Council, and

"Shall the City of Bassett, Nebraska, cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the City sufficient in rate and amount to pay the interest on and principal of said bonds as the same become due?"

- For said bonds and tax
- Against said bonds and tax

Electors voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "For said bonds and tax" following said proposition, and electors voting against said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "Against said bonds and tax" following said proposition.

"Shall Rock County, to assist the City of Bassett, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a swimming pool and related improvements be allowed to levy a property tax, not to exceed \$.02 per \$100.00 of taxable valuation in excess of all limits prescribed by law, (both statutory and constitutional restrictions) beginning with fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2025? Further, shall the County increase its budgeted restricted funds by the greater of \$136,000.00 or .02% of the county valuation over the current restricted funds for the purpose of exceeding the limits imposed by § 13-519 of the Nebraska Statutes and the constitutional and statutory limitations on county levies including §77-3442 of the Nebraska Statutes?"

EXPLANATION:

A vote for this proposition:
Would authorize the County Board of Commissioners of Rock County to levy an additional property tax of up to \$.02 per \$100.00 of taxable valuation to assist in paying for the construction and equipping of a swimming pool and related improvements to be owned by the City of Bassett, with this additional \$.02 to be allowed to exceed all statutory and constitutional limitations, including the "lid" on restricted funds imposed under §13-519 and the statutory levy limitation provided in §77-3442 of the Nebraska Statutes.

A vote against this proposition:
Would prevent the County Board of Commissioners of Rock County, Nebraska from levying an additional property tax in excess of statutory and constitutional limitations.
